Presidency Conclusions: Strategic Planning Process for Horizon Europe

- 1. The strategic planning process for Horizon Europe will be co-designed between the European Commission and the Member States, including a dialogue with the European Parliament. The legal status of the future Strategic Plan should be decided at the Competitiveness Council on 28 September 2018.
- 2. The process has two phases: (1) phase before the adoption of the legal acts of Horizon Europe (Framework Programme, Specific Programme); (2) phase after adoption of the legal acts.
- 3. On the basis of today's discussion and of the present Presidency conclusions, the Presidency will invite delegations to discuss the detailed process <u>immediately</u>, with a view to the process being endorsed at the next Council Competitiveness on 28 September in Brussels.
- 4. The Presidency concludes the following from today's discussion:
 - Member States need to have clarity on the elements which will be included in the Strategic Plan before agreeing on the process.
 - The Presidency therefore invites the European Commission to table an outline of the content of the Strategic Plan as soon as possible.
 - This outline will form the basis for discussions on technical level (Research Working Party, COREPER) until the Competitiveness Council meeting on 28 September 2018.
 - At the Competitiveness Council in September, Ministers should endorse the process and the outline of the elements to be included in the Strategic Plan.
 - The strategic planning process (taking into account the entire duration of Horizon Europe) will be enshrined in the legal acts of Horizon Europe.
