- Global council of research-intensive university networks
 - Australia, Go8
 - Canada, U15
 - China, C9
 - East Asia, AEARU
 - Europe, LERU
 - Germany, U15
 - Hong Kong 3
 - Japan, RU11
 - UK, Russell Group
 - US, AAU



- Yearly meetings, hosted by one of the networks
- Discussion on issues of common interest such as open science, academic freedom, importance of SSH, etc.



International collaboration (II)

- United Nations
 - Consultative status with the UN Economic and Social Council
 - Member of the UN Academic Impact





International dimension of ERA

1. Cooperation with countries outside EU 28 and Associated countries

- International collaboration is very important to LERU members:
 - They collaborate with institutions across the globe
 - They attract students from across the globe
 - Some have campuses in other parts of the world

LERU:

- Global council of research-intensive university networks
- United Nations
- In general: ERA priorities are important priorities for all global research players: important to be aware of what others do policy-wise and to align where possible.



International dimension of ERA

2. International cooperation in Horizon Europe:

- Association to Horizon Europe:
 - In favour of widening association to non-European countries such as Canada or Japan
 - First focus on countries that are in or closely linked to the ERA but not (yet) Associated
- Addressing societal and industrial challenges requires international collaboration → align Horizon Europe with SDGs and stimulate 3rd country participation
- Some practical recommendations:
 - Stimulate the inclusion of 3rd countries in 'normal' collaborative projects
 - Access to funding for research should be reciprocal (except in cases of specific strategic relevance)
 - Flagging of topics is helpful



International dimension of ERA

3. Cooperation with China, cooperation with Africa and Science Diplomacy

China:

- LERU members cooperate extensively with China
- No plans to change this, but increased awareness of potential problems

Africa

- African Research Universities Alliance
- KU Leuven study on cooperation between LERU members and African universities
- UK Global Challenges Research Fund
