Introductory / explanatory remarks:

- The Action Plan follows the thematic structure of the ERAC Opinion on the ERA review (1209/18). To give further emphasis to its full legitimacy, it makes primary reference (first column) to the Council conclusions of 30 November on the governance of the ERA (14989/18).
- Where applicable, each Council conclusion is complemented by the related Recommendation(s) in the ERAC Opinion (second column). ERAC recommendations without a strict and direct correspondence with the Council conclusions are included into the Action Plan as well.
- Different colours are used to distinguish between more strategic or policy-oriented actions and more operational or process-oriented actions.
- As to the timeframe of the Action Plan, the column with deadlines indicates by when the relevant action is expected to be completed. Unless indicated otherwise, the actions are expected to be undertaken with an appropriate timing to guarantee their completion within the indicated deadline.
