

#### Action 4 kick-off meeting with committed MS, ACs, SHs

#### European Framework for Research Careers

- Support for content and comprehensiveness of technical document (some improvements proposed in written)
- Importance of swift adoption
- Relevance of **sustainable funding** to implement measures to address precarity
- Aspect of mobility not only out of academia towards all sectors, but also back pointed out
- Importance of **recognising and supporting research careers broadly** (research management and support), but different timeline for Framework and action 17

#### Partnership for young researchers

- Better to refer to early-career researchers and avoid link with age
- Support from SHs for idea of coordination of funding with national and private one, but concern that FP funding may come at the expense of other important parts



#### **ERA Action 4 – A political partnership for young researchers?**

Member States, Commission, all public and private actors in the R&I system to **join forces** in a political partnership for attractive, sustainable, interoperable careers for early career researchers

#### **Setting standards**

• European Framework for Research Careers: *legislative initiative for attractive research careers* 

#### Supporting implementation

 Research & Innovation Careers Observatory (RICO); ERA Talent Platform; HR Excellence in Careers award; Competences framework (ResearchComp); Mutual Learning Exercises (PSF);...



### Rationale

#### The RRF will mobilise EUR 47,4 bn in R&I

#### Game changer for many countries





## **Objectives**

- To stress the contribution of R&I for the recovery and twin transitions
- To map the potential contribution of the RRF to the new EU R&I Policy Framework
- To support policy peer-learning in the design and implementation of (existing and future) measures
- To unveil "potential gaps" in the use of RRF for the new EU R&I Policy Framework (and identification of "potential future needs")




## Methodological note: understanding the results

- This is not an impact assessment
- RRF is not intended to contribute to ERA or NEIA. Mapping is not straight forward
- Overlap of measures. Possible double-counting of investments
- Interpretation of national results needs context
- RRPs will be revised (notably in view of REPowerEU)



### High directionality and variety of R&I investments...



Methodological Note: the data on Green and Digital R&I was taken from the FENIX database, considering only those measures that were assigned to the 'Green R&D&I' and 'Digital R&D&I' policy areas (either as primary or secondary policy areas). Instead, the data on Health, Gender and Cohesion was obtained based on DG R&I's own analysis and imply some degree of double counting as one investment may contribute to several key EU Objectives.




## ...that is mobilizing significant resources for the different ERA policy actions...

## **Preliminary conclusions**

- R&I has been recognized as a key vector for Europe's economic recovery and ensuring the type of recovery (green, digital, inclusive and cohesive) Europe wants.
- The RRPs will be a game changer in many MS because of the depth and scope of the reforms and investments
- The RRPs will also contribute to delivering the renewed ERA and NEIA
- There is scope for further peer policy learning based on the measures that have been adopted (for their implementation and the design of possible future measures)



## **Questions for discussion**

- Despite the importance of the R&I measures in the RRPs, do you foresee any potential gaps (in terms of investments and reforms) to provide an effective response to R&I weaknesses in your country?
- What are the lessons learnt on the RRF (i.e. linking investments to reforms with a high sense of directionality) that could be considered at EU level to address persistent national R&I weaknesses and support the delivery of an ERA policy agenda/ NEIA?
